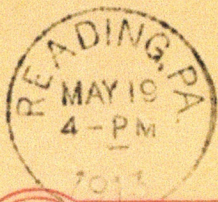

YOURSELF and family are cordially invited to attend the Ninth Annual Session of the Association of American Boyers, on Wednesday, June 18, 1913, in the well-known and Historic Ringing Rock Park, Pottstown, Pa. Pottstown is located in Montgomery County along the main line of the P. & R. Railway and the P. R. R., and is the terminus of the Phila. & Pottstown, the Reading, Boyertown and Pottstown Electric Railway. Ringing Rock Park is beautifully located along the Boyertown and Pottstown trolley road, and covers an area of over 200 acres of ground; contains a large and spacious pavilion where the services will be conducted; a large restaurant, and amusements. About an acre is covered with rocks noted for their difference in sound, not two stones having the same sound. To reach the park from Pottstown take the Boyertown trolley at Hanover St. and the P. & R. Railroad, a 5c. fare. A very good program has been arranged for the day, consisting of addresses, singing and music. Arrangements have been made with the management of the park to furnish the Boyers with dinner, to be served from 11 A. M. to 1 P. M. Buttons and pins of the Boyer Coat of Arms can be secured by addressing the Secretary, price 75 cents. Join the big army of Boyers! Send in your name with the annual dues, 50 cents, to the Secretary and have your name enrolled on the Family Register as a charter member, if you have not already done so. The Family Tree Charts to the number of one hundred or more will be on exhibition during the day. Come, bring your friends, and greet the Boyers, help to make this a day of pleasure. *Be registered on arriving.* The Reunion will be held rain or shine, as there is plenty of shelter in case of rain.
